#### Obair Rannsachaidh SMO ga Mhòr Mholadh

Chaidh toraidhean fhoillseachadh an-diugh (18 Dùbhlachd) bho sgrùdadh nàiseanta air obair rannsachaidh san Rìoghachd Aonaichte, agus fhuair obair sgoilearan an t-Sabhail Mhòr comharran fìor àrd mar phàirt de thagradh a chuir Oilthigh na Gàidhealtachd agus nan Eilean (OGE) a-steach.

Chuir OGE 81 neach-rannsachaidh air adhart airson an Fhrèam airson Sàr-mhathais ann an Rannsachadh (REF) le ochdnar ann an Ceiltis is Gàidhlig. Bha seachdnar dhiubh sin bho Shabhal Mòr Ostaig le aon neach-rannsachaidh aig a' phròiseict Soillse aig Colaisde a' Chaisteil. Chaidh 61% den rannsachadh a mheas aig na h-ìrean as àirde, le 16% air a mheas aig ìre cho àrd 's a gheibhear san t-saoghal agus 45% aig sàr ìre eadar-nàiseanta. Bha 33% eile air a mheas fìor mhath.

'S iad na ceithir buidhnean maoineachaidh airson foghlam àrd-ìre san Rìoghachd Aonaichte a chuir na sgrùdaidhean air dòigh airson an REF agus bidh na buidhnean maoineachaidh sin a' gabhail ealla ri toraidhean an REF nuair a bhios iad a' toirt taic-airgid do dh'ionadan foghlaim àrd-ìre airson obair rannsachaidh bho 2015-16.

Seo dìreach an dàrna turas a chaidh sgrùdadh a dhèanamh air obair rannsachaidh Sabhal Mòr Ostaig. Chaidh Measadh air Rannsachadh (RAE) a chumail ann an 2008 agus chaidh ceathrar luchdrannsachaidh bhon t-Sabhal Mhòr a chur air adhart an uair sin. Tha meud agus inbhe an rannsachaidh a thathar a' dèanamh aig SMO air a dhol suas gu mòr bhon uair sin agus tha an àrainneachd rannsachaidh air a bhith air a neartachadh tro phròiseactan mòra nàiseanta mar Shoillse, Uinneag dhan Àird an Iar agus Faclair na Gàidhlig.

Thuirt Prionnsapal Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, am Proifeasair Boyd Robasdan: "Tha na toraidhean seo air leth math agus nan dearbhadh air an adhartas a thathar air a dhèanamh ann an obair rannsachaidh is sgoilearachd bho àm an sgrùdaidh mu dheireadh. Còmhla ris na measaidhean a chaidh a dhèanamh air obair teagaisg na Colaiste nas tràithe air a' bhliadhna, tha iad a' sealltainn cho fìor mhath sa tha am foghlam a thathar a' tairgse an seo agus na buannachdan a gheibh oileanaich bho bhith air an oideachadh le luchd-teagaisg is luchdrannsachaidh a tha cho comasach."

Thuirt Iain T. MacLeòid, Stiùiriche an Fhoghlaim: "Tha sinn air leth uasal às an luchd-rannsachaidh againn gu lèir agus tha piseach mhòr air tighinn air obair rannsachaidh fo stiùireadh an Dr Gillian Rothach, le taic bhon Oll. Richard Cox agus buill eile de chomataidhean rannsachaidh na Colaiste. Tha an com-pàirteachadh le Oilthigh na Gàidhealtachd agus nan Eilean air leth cudromach agus tha e na adhbhar toileachais dhuinn uile gun robh toraidhean iomlan an REF aig OGE cho fìor mhath."

Thuirt Iar-Stiùiriche an Fhoghlaim an Dr Gillian Rothach: "'S e aithneachadh fìor mhath a tha seo bho eòlaichean rannsachaidh nàiseanta air ar n-obair rannsachaidh. Bidh sinn a' togail air na deagh thoraidhean seo airson an ath mheasadh nàiseanta ann an còig bliadhna eile. Tha sinn ag amas air taic dhar luchdrannsachaidh a neartachadh, agus air ginealach ùr de luchdrannsachaidh a thogail, aig OGE agus ann an Alba air fad. Bidh àite cudromach aig Soillse ann a bhith a' coileanadh seo."

#### Research at Sabhal Mòr Ostaig Commended

The outcomes from an assessment of research at higher education institutions in the UK were published this week, and researchers from Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, which formed part of a submission from the University of the Highlands and Islands (UHI), were among those to receive the highest grade for their work.

UHI submitted the work of 81 researchers for the Research Excellence Framework (REF) with eight in Celtic and Gaelic studies. Of those, seven were from Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, with the eighth being a Soillse researcher from Lews Castle College. 61% of the Gaelic research submission was awarded the highest ratings, with 16% judged to be exceptional/world-leading and 45% internationally excellent. Another 33% was assessed as very good.


The four UK higher education funding bodies undertake the REF assessments and they will use the assessment outcomes to inform the selective allocation of their research funding to higher education institutions, with effect from 2015-16.

This was only the second time that Sabhal Mòr's research was assessed. A Research Assessment Exercise (RAE) was carried out in 2008, when four researchers from Sabhal Mòr were put forward for scrutiny. There has been a significant increase in both the volume and esteem of the research being carried out at Sabhal Mòr since then. The research environment has been strengthened through large national projects, such as Soillse, Window to the West, and the Dictionary of the Scottish Gaelic Language.

The Principal of Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, Professor Boyd Robertson, said: "These results are exceptionally good and show the progress made in research and scholarship since the last audit. Taken along with the reviews of teaching at the College conducted earlier this year, they demonstrate the quality of the educational provision here and the benefits students can derive from being educated by such skilled lecturers and researchers"

John N. MacLeod, Director of Studies, said: "We are extremely proud of all our research staff and there has been a significant increase in research activity and outputs under the leadership of Dr Gillian Munro, with support from Prof Richard Cox and other members of SMO research committees. The partnership with the University of the Highlands and Islands is very important and we are delighted that UHI has achieved such commendable results overall in the REF."

Deputy Head of Education, Dr Gillian Munro, commented: "This is wonderful recognition from national experts of our research work. We will build on these great results in the next assessment exercise, in five years' time. We aim to improve support for our research staff and to grow a new generation of researchers, both at UHI and in Scotland as a whole. The Soillse project will have an important part to play in achieving this."




